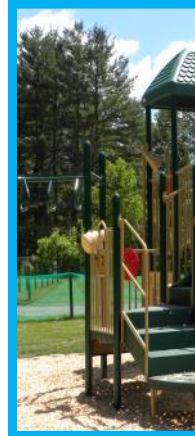

The Grand Opening of the Thompson Terrace playground was in May 2012. Building the space was primarily funded through the Pig & Wolf Live(stock) Art Project Auction. The playground is well used by the surrounding neighborhood and community, with the Pavilion being available to rent for events.
